2. E-Books:

netLibrary: We subscribe to thousands of current, academic e-books through *netLibrary*. Access items through *CougarCat* or directly from *netLibrary* (www.netlibrary.com). For remote access, first use a CCC computer to create your free account.

Freebies: Any out-of-copyright (“public domain”) classic is likely to be available on the Web. Try the U. Penn’s *Online Books Page* (digital.library.upenn.edu/books/) Our website links to additional providers: **Research Gateway >> Find E-Books**



Periodicals: Research, News, Hot Topics & Features

Journals: formal, peer-reviewed articles in which researchers report their new work

Magazines: news and features for non-specialists or the general public

Academic Search Premier - all-purpose index for undergraduate research, extensive full-text

Religion & Philosophy Collection – includes 250 full-text academic titles in these fields

Try the **Subject Terms** tab to browse subject headings for more precise results.

Use **Refine Search** to find items available in **full text** or held at CCC or to limit to articles >1 page long.

Articles that are not full-text and not held at CCC may be obtained through **Interlibrary Loan**.
